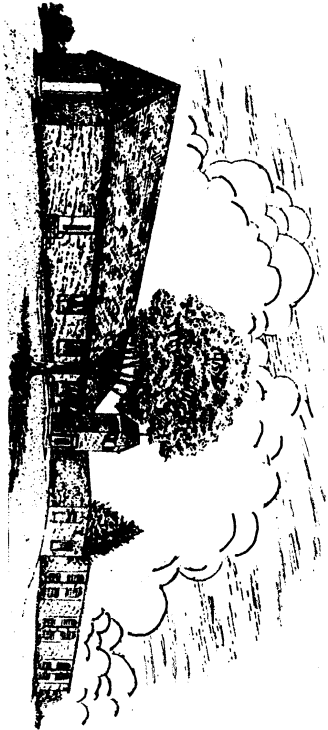

You may be familiar with the importance of the number 40 in the Bible. After all, it pops up in the Good Book 159 times, across both the Old and New Testaments. God flooded the earth for 40 days and nights. Moses fasted for 40 days, and Jesus wandered the wilderness for, yes, 40 days. Overall, it's a number associated with testing and the hardships one must endure to become more spiritually aware.

The Christian season of Lent also lasts for 40 days as we take a journey in space and in spirit toward Easter Sunday. The 40 days of Lent begin with Ash Wednesday which is March 2 this year.

I vividly remember that it was an Ash Wednesday service two years ago when we determined that it would not be advisable to have Holy Communion because of the onset of the pandemic. Last year we didn't even find it possible to observe Ash Wednesday.

This year please come to our Ash Wednesday service on Wednesday, March 2 at 7:00 p.m. We will hear God's word calling us to this season of introspection, devotion and renewal; we will celebrate the Lord's Supper, and we will experience the application of *ashes* which is the traditional symbol of repentance.

We will also have a **Good Friday service this year on April 15 at 7:00 pm.** We will celebrate the sacrifice Jesus made for us and the salvation he offered to us in a traditional Tenebrae Service (a service of light and shadow). The prayers and lessons on this night will center around the story of our salvation depicted by our beautiful and unique stained glass windows. This will also be the service of First Communion for our confirmation students: Lucas Meier, Logan Spicer and Jayden Green.

Here is hoping that this year our 40 days leading up to Easter will be 40 days of anticipation and hope for a long-awaited sense of normalcy (or even better!).

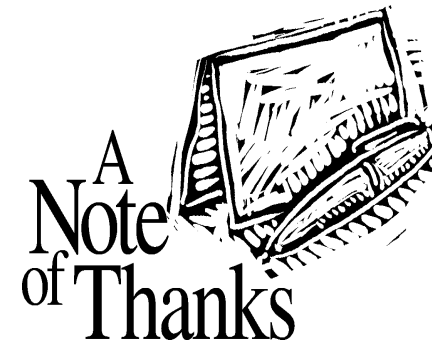

Today, someone we know may need to hear words of hope, faith, and life. We can follow Jesus' example and use the power of words to share the good news.

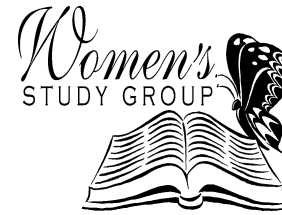

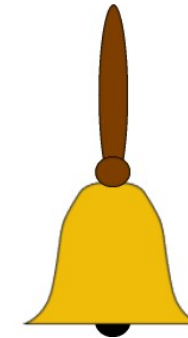

As things begin to return to "normal", future events are being discussed. Several of the events that have been held in the past are the community dinners. In order for those to take place again, a number of individuals in our congregation will need to hold a ServSafe or Food Handlers Certification. These are a must through the Jefferson County Health Department. Due to COVID and the absence of these events, all certificates on file in the church office have expired. We are also needed one or two kitchen managers.

The Jefferson County Health Department holds manager's classes once a month in either High Ridge or at Jefferson County Community College.
